


Our learning outcome is driven by our commitment to developing medical professionals with dynamic skills including:

Year 1 Field Trip

This year's field trip was a wonderful trip to Prachinburi and Sakaeow Provinces. There, YI students were introduced to the beginnings of our Thai civilization at Si Mahosot Ancient City. The Lord Buddha's footprint along with a collection of historic ruins showed us the construction of an oval-shaped city was constructed in the Dvaravati Period (6th-13th centuries), and covers an area of nearly 280 acres.

The 3-day trip also visited historical and educational sites including the Prachin Buri National Museum and Sdok Kok Thom temple complex in Sa Kaeo province is among the smaller of the Khmer temples in Northeast Thailand. The temple that is also known as Prasat Sdok Kak Thom or Prasat Sdok Kuk Thom was built dedicated to the Hindu God Shiva. It was constructed halfway the 11th century.

This educational field trip is always the highlight of the first year as students, instructors, staff and Deans are all able to travel together to build a tight-knit team that is the MDKMITL family.

MDKMITL is always looking for wonderful opportunities for the world's most renowned experts to share their knowledge, insight and experience with our student body.




